1. ACTIVITY RECAP:

2. SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES:

DISABLED VEHICLES: Police were dispatched to over 30 vehicles that were disabled due to weather conditions. In one case, PENDOT had not plowed SR 143 making the roadway impassable. Even EMS vehicles couldn't negotiate the hill and other resources from the north side of the area had to be dispatched as PENDOT was busy with other priority plow operations in the northern end of the county. Weather conditions also were responsible for limiting our opportunities to conduct traffic enforcement operations during the storm and its aftermath.

83-21-00277 GENERAL ASSIST: Police responded to a Fleetwood Borough resident who was stuck in her alley due to snow conditions and reported she was needed at work due to a critical staffing shortage caused by the storm. She as a nurse at the Tipton Home and she was provided a ride to work by police.

83-21-00378 BURGLARY: Police are investigating the reported burglary of a Fleetwood Borough residential garage. The actor was scared off prior to police arrival by the homeowner.

83-21-00377 DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Police responded to what was reported to possibly a drive by shooting at the intersection of Richmond and Arch Streets. Police responded and investigation determined that several juvenile males were playing a game of wat with air soft guns. Investigation failed to locate any damaged property and participants were advised of the potential danger of them partaking in such conduct in a residential area.

83-21-00270 PRIVATE PROPERTY RR CRASH: Police responded to the Ridge Rd Railroad crossing where a vehicle that had become stuck on the tracks due to the snowstorm. The driver had abandoned the vehicle partially on the tracks to go summon help. Prior to the vehicle's removal a train struck the unoccupied vehicle.

83-21-00506 RAPE: Fleetwood Police are investigating a historical rape reported to involve junior/senior high school students from last summer. The alleged rape was reported to school personnel who initiated a Childline Report.

83-21-00359 STALKING: Fleetwood Police received a call to report that stalking type activity is be taken against a woman who originally reported she was a Fleetwood resident. During the course of investigating the allegations it was determined that her residence fell just over the municipal boundary into Alsace Twp and all information was forwarded to PSP Reading for follow up.

83-21-00504/300/521/314/494: Publisher's Clearing House and related type scams. Money ranging from \$500 to \$5000 has been stolen from people throughout our jurisdiction.

83-21-00355 IDENTITY THEFT: Police are investi8gating a report by a Richmond Township resident that his identity was used to take out A \$70,000 car loan for a new Audi in Texas.

3. PERSONNEL:

Part time Officer BEKESY began part 2 of FTO program.

I request approval to hire retired Trooper Cory REMP as our part time criminal investigator pending successful completion of background/physical/medical requirements. He has worked with several different task forces during his employment with the state police and even service Fleetwood PD as a member of the Troop L Vice Unit in past years.

All officers have completed required annual legal update certification with the exception of Officer Quinn who is scheduled to attend next week.

Chief Stinsky renewed his Taser Instructor certification.

Chief Stinsky has completed the Force Science Institute De-Escalation Instructor training and is developing departmental de-escalation training which will be incorporated into our spring firearms qualification period.

4. EQUIPMENT:

Ammunition ordered for Spring Qualification period, including some less lethal options to increase our capabilities.

5. PROJECTED ACTIVITIES / ISSUES:

Richmond Street railroad crossing signal malfunctions, appears to have been rectified.

AGGRESSIVE DRIVING grant will be in effect between March 18th and April 25th.

Fleetwood Police will be supporting 2 “Coffee with a Cop” type events 3/27 0900-1200 in Topton by the pool and 4/3 from 1100-1400 in Fleetwood at Fleetwood Beverage.
