2. SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES:

FLEETWOOD

83-21-02153 ARSON: Police responded to a Fleetwood Borough residence where a fire had bet set beneath a bedroom window. Investigation determined that the fire was set by A 14 YOA borough resident who has been charged and is currently being held in a juvenile facility.

83-21-02084 FOUND PROPERTY: \$720.00 turned in by a Fleetwood resident, owner was located, and money returned.

83-21-02049 HARASSMENT: Police responded to a report of a person possibly in possession of a firearm at the carnival who was engaged in an ongoing harassment type incident involving multiple jurisdictions. RUSCOMBMANOR
